

The **ABC**
of anaphylaxis symptoms

A

Airways

- Swelling of tongue/throat/lips
- Hoarse voice
- Persevering cough
- Difficulty breathing/swallowing

B

Breathing

- Shortness of breath
- Noisy breathing or wheeze
- Difficulty talking

C

Circulation

- Feeling faint or dizzy
- Loss of consciousness
- Feeling confused
- Pale and clammy skin
- Rapid or weak pulse

Vomiting, abdominal pain, diarrhoea or a rash may also be present.

The training device and the active device should not be routinely carried together to minimise the risk of confusion between the two devices in an emergency situation.

- **Always** carry your two Anapen[®] devices with you to ensure the recommended dose can be given
- **Make sure** you and those closest to you are familiar with these instructions, so you can avoid uncertainty in an emergency

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



How to use **Anapen**[®]

adrenaline (epinephrine)

Top tips:

- Anapen[®] can be given through clothing, including denim
- Use Anapen[®] without delay at the first onset of symptoms
- If possible lie down with your legs elevated following administration of Anapen[®]



You should always get medical help immediately after using Anapen. Call 999 or 112; ask for an ambulance and state 'anaphylaxis' even if symptoms are improving.

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
